SUBJECT: Table of Organization and Equipment 1-67 for the Civilian Irregular Defense Group (CIDG) Program.

TO: See Distribution

1. All TOE's previously published by this Headquarters are hereby rescinded. This TOE is effective upon receipt.
2. Company commanders may tailor their assets to accomplish their mission in their Corps areas. However, the strength limits and rank authorization for each Corps area will, under no circumstances, be exceeded.
 - a. Each company is authorized 920 men for its Mike Force and guerrilla forces (see ANNEX A). *Rescinded 29 June 68*
 - b. Each "A" Detachment in the CIDG role is authorized four (4) CIDG companies (see ANNEX B), two (2) combat reconnaissance platoons (see ANNEX C), and one (1) Civic Action-Psychological Operations (CA/PO) squad (see ANNEX D). No CIDG personnel are authorized for "A" detachments in a sector/subsector role only.
 - c. Each "A" detachment camp which has assigned to it two (2) 105mm howitzers is authorized the Light Artillery Section (see ANNEX E).
 - d. Each "A" detachment which has assigned to it two (2) 106mm recoilless rifles is authorized the Light Recoilless Rifle Section (see ANNEX F).
3. Separate "B" detachments such as Projects Sigma and Omega are authorized to organize and equip under ANNEX G.
4. Detachment B-52, Project Delta, is authorized to organize and equip under ANNEX H.
5. Detachment B-55 is authorized to organize and equip under ANNEX I.
6. Detachment B-51 is authorized to organize and equip under ANNEX J.
7. Detachments A-502 and A-503 are authorized to organize and equip under ANNEX K.



SEE DISTRIBUTION

Part I GENERAL:

1. All Mobile Strike Force (Mike Force) TO&E's previously published by this Headquarters are rescinded. This TO&E is effective upon receipt.
2. Commanders will organize units as depicted in inclosed TO&E's MS-1, MS-2, and MS-3. No change in strength ceilings, rank structure or organization are authorized without the written approval of this Headquarters.

Part II ORGANIZATION AND STRENGTH LEVELS:

1. The 16th Mobile Strike Force Command, Detachment C-1, I CTZ is authorized one (1) Mobile Strike Force Battalion of three (3) 184 man rifle companies per battalion; one (1) 135 man Reconnaissance Company and one (1) 224 man Headquarters and Service Company. Total strength of the 16th MSF Command is 911.
2. The 20th Mobile Strike Force Command, Detachment C-2, II CTZ is authorized three (3) Mobile Strike Force Battalions of three (3) 184 man companies per battalion; one (1) 135 man Reconnaissance Company and one (1) 224 man Headquarters and Service Company. Total strength of the 20th MSF Command is 2015.
3. The 36th Mobile Strike Force Command, Detachment C-3, III CTZ is authorized three (3) Mobile Strike Force Battalions of three (3) 184 man rifle companies per battalion; one (1) 135 man Reconnaissance Company and one (1) 224 man Headquarters and Service Company. Total strength of the 36th MSF Command is 2015.
4. The 40th Mobile Strike Force Command, Detachment C-4, IV CTZ is authorized three (3) Mobile Strike Force Battalions of three (3) 184 man rifle companies per battalion; one (1) 135 man Reconnaissance Company, one (1) 224 man Headquarters and Service Company and one (1) 184 man Airboat Company. The Airboat Company will be organized according to Annex D Table of Organization and Equipment for IV Corps Mobile Strike Force (Airborne), Headquarters Company D, 5th SFGA dtd 27 Oct 67. 23 additional personnel will be added to this TO&E as a maintenance section bringing the total strength of the Airboat Company to 184 men. Total strength of the 40th MSF Command is 2199.





SECTION I

GENERAL

ORGANIZATION

1. MISSION:

- a. Constitute a Corps Tactical Zone reserve reaction force.
- b. Conduct combat operations within the CIDG camp TAOR to relieve enemy pressure on the camp.
- c. Reinforcement of CIDG camp defense systems when attack is imminent.
- d. Reinforce CIDG camps under attack.
- e. Conduct mobile guerrilla type operations.
- f. Conduct multi-company small scale conventional combat operations.
- g. Conduct raids, ambushes, combat patrols, and search and destroy operations in designated areas.
- h. Constitute a reaction and exploitation force responsive to hard intelligence produced by reconnaissance units.

2. ASSIGNMENT: Organic to the Airborne Mobile Strike Force of the Mobile Strike Force Command.

3. CAPABILITIES:

- a. To conduct small scale conventional type operations.
- b. To conduct separate mobile guerrilla operations for durations up to thirty days in enemy controlled areas.
- c. To participate in "Eagle Flight" (Heliborne Exploitation Force) operations.
- d. To conduct search and destroy operations as a part of a multi-company size effort (Airborne Mobile Strike Force).
- e. To participate as part of an exploitation Force reacting to hard intelligence generated by reconnaissance.
- f. To be inserted into an area of operations by helicopter, parachute assault, or overland for the purpose of conducting combat operations.

4. BASIS OF ALLOCATION: Three per Airborne Mobile Strike Force Battalion.

5. MOBILITY: This unit is completely foot mobile and capable of performing heliborne and parachute assaults.

EQUIPMENT

1. This table is in accordance with present and future doctrine. CIDG Forces are allocated by Headquarters, 5th Special Forces Group (Airborne) Letter of Instructions. Such allocation is authority to requisition and issue, in accordance with priorities established on the control of combat critical items, all items listed herein unless otherwise indicated.

2. The TOE designates Automatic Riflemen within the Rifle Squad but authorizes the Rifle, 5.56mm, M16A1. This was necessary to provide a basis for issuing the carbine, cal. 30, M2 and the Browning Automatic Rifle cal. 30 as an in lieu of item in the event the M16 Rifle is not available in sufficient quantity or the equipment must undergo a modification during the post-hostilities period.

(SECTION I Cont.)

3. Basic loads will be determined by the Airborne Mobile Strike Force Commander.
4. Items of individual clothing and equipment is as authorized in section III para 06.
5. This table contains the minimum essential quantities and types of equipment necessary to accomplish the mission of the unit. When additional equipment is required, written justification will be submitted to HQ, 5th SFGA for approval. This approval will be disseminated in a letter of Instructions, the receipt of which is the authority to request and issue the indicated items of equipment.
6. Allowances of equipment may be decreased or omitted at the direction of the Mobile Strike Force Command, Airborne Mobile Strike Force, or US Special Forces Company Commanders.



RECONNAISSANCE COMPANY

SECTION I - GENERAL

ORGANIZATION

1. MISSION: The mission of the Reconnaissance Company is to perform long-range reconnaissance and other special operations as directed by the Mobile Strike Force Command Commanding Officer.
2. ASSIGNMENT: One Reconnaissance Company assigned to each Mobile Strike Force Command (Airborne).
3. CAPABILITIES: At full strength this unit has the following capabilities:
 - a. Provide reconnaissance teams to collect intelligence in denied areas.
 - b. Provide special action platoons to engage limited targets of opportunity.
4. MOBILITY: The mobility of this unit is dependent upon augmentation of air support. All personnel are airborne qualified.
5. APPLICABILITY: This TO&E will be utilized by the Reconnaissance Companies of the 16th, 20th, 36th, and 40th Mobile Strike Force Commands (Airborne).

EQUIPMENT

1. This table is the authority to requisition and issue in accordance with procedures directed by Headquarters, 5th Special Forces Group (Airborne), 1st Special Forces.
2. Individual allowances for all grades are listed in paragraph 05 of section III.
3. Allowances of equipment authorized herein may be decreased or omitted at the discretion of the USASF Detachment Commander. Equipment in excess of authorized allowance will not be requisitioned without approval of this headquarters.



SECTION I

GENERAL

ORGANIZATION

1. MISSION: The Mobile Strike Headquarters and Service Company is designated to provide administrative, logistical, and fire support and installation security for the Mobile Strike Force Command (Airborne). The mission of this unit is:
 - a. To provide clerical, medical, armorer, and logistical support to the Mobile Strike Force Command (Airborne).
 - b. To Provide maintenance support to the MSF Comd (Abn).
 - c. To provide installation security for the MSF Comd (Abn) base and Forward Operational Bases.
 - d. To provide direct and indirect fire support for the MSF Comd (Abn).
 - *e. To provide platoon size reconnaissance units to the Mobile Strike Forces.
2. ASSIGNMENT: One Headquarters and Service Company assigned to each Mobile Strike Force Command (Airborne).
3. CAPABILITIES: At full strength this unit has the following capabilities:
 - a. Provide detachable cellular type indirect fire support units with the capability to:
 - (1) Provide close artillery support for Mobile Strike Forces engaged in combat operations.
 - (2) Provide medium range artillery support against enemy area targets.
 - (3) Provide artillery support for installation defense.
 - (4) Tailor indirect fire support units commensurate with assigned missions and operational situations.
 - b. Provide detachable cellular type direct fire support units with the capability to:
 - (1) Provide medium and heavy anti-tank fire support.
 - (2) Provide medium and heavy direct fire support against point targets.
 - (3) Tailor direct fire support units commensurate with assigned missions and operational situations.

c. Provide guard details for installation and Forward Operational Base Security.

d. Conduct local security ambushes and patrols.

e. Provide 1st and 2nd echelon maintenance support for assigned vehicles and generators.

f. Provide administrative and personnel accounting support for the Mobile Strike Force Command (Airborne).

g. Provide logistical and ~~armorer~~ support for the Mobile Strike Force Command (Airborne).

h. Provide indigenous medical personnel to:

(1) Establish a dispensary for the Mobile Strike Force Command (Airborne).

(2) Conduct sick call for dependents of the Mobile Strike Force Command (Airborne).

(3) Provide replacement medical personnel for the Mobile Strike Force units.

ii. Provide detachable platoon size reconnaissance units with the capability to:

(1) Be attached to the Mobile Strike Forces in accordance with the mission and operational situation.

(2) Conduct platoon size operations in support of installation security.

4. MOBILITY: The mobility of this unit is dependent upon outside sources. All personnel except the nurses are airborne qualified.

5. APPLICABILITY: This TO&E will be utilized by the Headquarters and Service Companies of the 16th, 20th, 36th, 40th and 55th Mobile Strike Force Commands (Airborne) with the exception of the three combat reconnaissance platoons are organic only to the 55th MSF Command (Abn).

EQUIPMENT

1. This table is the authority to requisition and issue in accordance with procedures directed by Headquarters, 5th Special Forces Group (Airborne), 1st Special Forces.

2. Individual allowances for all grades are listed in paragraph 17 of Section III.

3. Allowances of equipment authorized herein may be decreased or omitted by the USASF detachment commander. Equipment in excess of authorized allowance

SECTION 1

GENERAL

ORIENTATION

I. MISSION:

- a. Conduct harassment and interception along border corridors against Viet Cong infiltrators from Laos, Cambodia and north of the 17th parallel into the Republic of Vietnam.
- b. Harass and conduct raids against Viet Cong secret zones and bases.
- c. Harass and intercept the Viet Cong on their inland communication routes connecting one zone to another.
- d. Collect intelligence information on the areas mentioned in a and b above.
- e. Participate in special operations prescribed by the Joint General Staff.

2. ASSIGNMENT: Based on geographical areas as directed by headquarters Vietnamese Special Forces High Command in conjunction with 3rd, 5th SF Gp (Abn). Each company commander is authorized Corps CILC assets on the basis of four companies per "A" detachment camp in the CILC role. These forces may be deployed at the discretion of the company commander.

3. CAPABILITIES:

a. At full strength, this unit has the following capabilities:

- (1) Conduct raids, ambushes, and combat and intelligence patrols.
- (2) Search and seizure operations on a limited scale.
- (3) Small scale conventional combat operations.
- (4) Conduct of basic psychological operations, i. e., distribution of leaflets, face-to-face meetings, assistance in all types of civic action programs, etc.
- (5) Production of intelligence for its own use and in response to the commanders' EBI.

b. As noted in the remarks section, additional equipment provides this unit with the capability of establishing reconnaissance and surveillance screens (CICG Border Surveillance Mission).

c. The unit is capable of defending itself and its installations.

4. MOBILITY. Mobility of this unit is dependent upon outside sources as no vehicles are organic.
